Spark Good Local Grants

Walmart Foundation's Spark Good Local Grants empower local organizations making a difference in their communities through grassroots projects.

- Focus: Community development, education, health, and hunger relief.
- **Eligibility**: Organizations serving the same area as the Walmart facility from which they request funding.
- Grant Amount: \$250 to \$5,000.
- Application Window: August 1 October 15, 2025
- How to Apply: Apply through <u>Walmart's Spark Good platform</u>.

Looking Out Foundation Grants

Founded by musicians Brandi Carlile and Tim Hanseroth, the Looking Out Foundation funds causes and nonprofits working to impact lives through justice, health, and equity.

- **Funder**: Looking Out Foundation
- **Focus**: Disadvantaged youth, public health, women, the environment, the arts, community development, human and civil rights, hunger, and homelessness.
- Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations addressing the foundation's focus areas.
- Grant Amount: \$1,000 to \$5,000.
- Application Deadline: August 1, 2025
- How to Apply: Submit applications through the <u>foundation's website</u>.

TFEC Grant Cycle 3

The Foundation for Enhancing Communities (TFEC) strengthens the South Central Pennsylvania region through grantmaking and support to nonprofits and charitable programs.

- **Funder**: The Foundation for Enhancing Communities (TFEC)
- Focus: Arts & culture, community development, education, environment, health & human services.
- Eligibility: Nonprofits serving communities within TFEC's service area.
- Application Deadline: September 1, 2025
- How to Apply: Apply through TFEC's online grant portal.



Connecticut Community Foundation General Grants

Connecticut Community Foundation works to foster community well-being by supporting local nonprofits and initiatives in a 21-town region of Greater Waterbury and Litchfield Hills.

- Funder: Connecticut Community Foundation
- **Focus**: Building equitable opportunity, health and environmental justice, older adults, strengthening nonprofits.
- Eligibility: Nonprofits serving residents in the foundation's 21-town service area.
- Application Deadline: October 15, 2025
- **How to Apply**: Submit applications through the foundation's <u>GOapply portal</u>.

NEA Grants for Arts Program – Cycle 2

The National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) is an independent federal agency that supports arts excellence and innovation across the U.S.

- Funder: National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)
- **Focus**: Public engagement with the arts, arts education, and integration of the arts with health and community well-being.
- **Eligibility**: Nonprofit organizations with at least five years of arts programming prior to the application deadline.
- **Grant Amount**: \$10,000 to \$100,000 (1:1 cost-share/match required).
- Application Deadline: July 22, 2025
- How to Apply: Submit applications through the <u>NEA's online portal</u>.

Cummings Foundation \$30 Million Grant Program

Cummings Foundation, one of the largest private foundations in New England, gives back to communities in Massachusetts by investing in nonprofits improving lives.

- Funder: Cummings Foundation
- Focus: Programs that benefit communities in Massachusetts across various sectors.
- Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations serving Massachusetts communities.
- **Grant Amount**: Up to \$100,000 over three years; select organizations may receive 10-year grants.
- Letter of Inquiry Deadline: September 6, 2025, at 5:00 PM
- How to Apply: Submit a Letter of Inquiry via the foundation's online portal.



Chester County Community Foundation – Fund for ChesCo Capacity Building Grants

The Chester County Community Foundation connects people who care with causes that matter, offering grants and resources to local nonprofits.

- Funder: Chester County Community Foundation
- Focus: Capacity building for nonprofits in Chester County, Pennsylvania.
- Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations serving Chester County.
- Grant Amount: Varies.
- Application Window: July 1 September 11, 2025
- How to Apply: Submit applications via email to grants@chescocf.org.

American Heart Association Institutional Award for Undergraduate Student Training

- Application Deadline: September 15, 2025

- Eligibility: Nonprofits and social movements
- Grant Amounts: Varies

The Skoll Foundation

The Skoll Foundation invests in social entrepreneurs and their innovative approaches to solving critical social issues. They provide funding through the Skoll Awards for Social Entrepreneurship, supporting leaders whose work has the potential for large-scale impact.

- Grant Amounts: Typically up to \$1 million

MacArthur Foundation

The MacArthur Foundation supports creative people, effective institutions, and influential networks building a more just, verdant, and peaceful world. Their grantmaking includes areas like climate solutions, criminal justice reform, and nuclear challenges.

- Funding Focus: Large-scale solutions to critical social problems
- Eligibility: Nonprofits and collaborations
- Grant Amounts: Up to \$100 million
- How to Apply: Applications open periodically on MacArthur Foundation.

The David and Lucile Packard Foundation

The David and Lucile Packard Foundation provides grants to nonprofit organizations that work on improving the lives of children, families, and communities. They focus on conservation, health, and population, seeking initiatives that create a lasting impact on society and the environment.

- Funding Focus: Conservation, children's health, and reproductive rights
- Eligibility: Nonprofits and research organizations
- Grant Amounts: Varies

- Eligibility: Nonprofits, community organizations, and researchers
- Grant Amounts: Typically between \$50,000 and \$500,000

Google.org is a program that uses Google's vast resources to support underserved communities. They do this by providing funding, technical expertise, and innovation.

- Funding Focus: Technology-driven social impact solutions
- Eligibility: Nonprofits and social enterprises
- Grant Amounts: Typically, between \$250,000 and \$1 million
- **How to Apply:** Submit proposals when applications open at <u>Google.org</u>.

HUD Community Development Block Grants

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program provides annual grants on a formula basis to states, cities, and counties to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment, and by expanding economic opportunities, principally for low- and moderate-income people.

- Funding Focus: Affordable housing, job creation, infrastructure development
- Eligibility: Local governments, nonprofits
- Grant Amounts: Varies based on community needs
- How to Apply: Find opportunities at <u>HUD CDBG</u>.

U.S. EDA Grants

The U.S. Economic Development Administration's investment policy is designed to establish a foundation for sustainable job growth and the building of durable regional economies throughout the United States. This foundation builds upon two key economic drivers - innovation and regional collaboration.

- Funding Focus: Economic development, innovation, and job creation
- Eligibility: State and local governments, nonprofits, educational institutions
- Grant Amounts: Typically, between \$100,000 and \$3 million
- How to Apply: Visit <u>EDA.gov</u> for open solicitations.
